Evaluation Methods Used: The application has been tested by a qualified accessibility tester who is a Trusted Tester by the US Department of Homeland Security and Certified Professional in Web Accessibility (CPWA) by the International Association of Accessibility Professionals (IAAP). Testing was based on general product knowledge and common documented use cases for most users. Testing methods include using a combination of manual and automated techniques using axe[™] - an automated accessibility rule engine and NVDA, a free and open-source screen reader. Adhoc evaluation of the code was also completed, where appropriate.
